The Warendorf visit

Our big event this summer has been the visit of the Warendorfers in mid-July to celebrate the 10th anniversary of our twinning. For those of you who were not involved, here is a brief account of our activities:

With Brexit uppermost in everyone's minds, it was probably inevitable that the Germans asked about our future allegiances (!), but they were assured that Twinning was alive and well and would continue for many years to come.



Highlights of this year's exchange were a full day trip to Oxford, a visit to Butser Ancient Farm, and a (much-appreciated) guided tour of Loseley House near Guildford. In Oxford, each of the twinners and their continental partners shared the experience of visiting a college, exploring the Ashmolean Museum or simply drifting down the river on a punt. The fact that some Petersfielders had not had such experiences before made the joint discoveries all the more exciting.

The Twinning Garden

The Association is in the throes of acquiring the loan of a plot of land between the Festival Hall and the open air swimming pool where we can develop a Twinning Garden dedicated to the community. As the years go by, new horticultural gifts will fill it to capacity and will

enhance our town and stand as a testament to the peaceful social, cultural and historical interchange between France, Germany and Britain.

The first planting will occur this autumn, when some *escallonia*, a gift from the Warendorf Mayor will be used to create a back border to the plot. The Warendorf *Freundeskreis* has also given us money to plant a rosebush in the plot. We already have a small bush from Barentin from last year's visit and we are transplanting a rose previously received that is currently in the Festival Hall Rose



Room Garden. We would appreciate it very much if some members could volunteer to maintain the plot over the autumn and winter months – and, at the same time, suggest a plan for its development.

Please make a note in your diaries of next year's Warendorf visit dates: 23rd -29th August.

During the Warendorf visit, there were brief discussions with several sets of people who may be participating in the tenth anniversary celebrations next year: Petersfield Scouts, Petersfield Golf Club and, hopefully, both Herne Junior School and The Petersfield School. In addition, we are thinking of sending over a choir to join in the fun! Let's hope that some of these groups will bring their discussions to fruition...
